



General statement on conflict minerals

Dear Customers,

The following statement applies to all unassembled printed circuit boards produced by the KSG Group. Exploitation and trade in conflict minerals originate in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and finance regional armed conflicts that result in environmental damage, human rights violations and social suffering.

With the Congo Conflict Minerals Act of 2010, Section 1502, and corresponding OECD Guideline "Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas", U.S. legislation has acted to prevent the trade in conflict minerals. In the European Union, trade in conflict minerals is prohibited by Regulation 2017/ 821/EU.

KSG takes this responsibility seriously and expects its suppliers to comply strictly with the specific legal requirements. We periodically ask our suppliers for verification of such compliance, including details of the smelting works.

For that reason, gold and tin for the manufacture of unassembled printed circuit boards are not sourced from relevant conflict or high-risk areas. Tungsten and tantalum are not used in our manufacturing processes.
